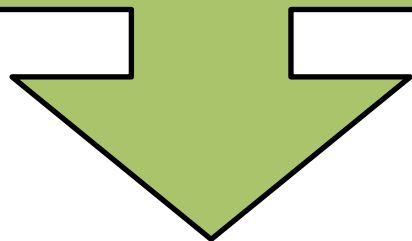


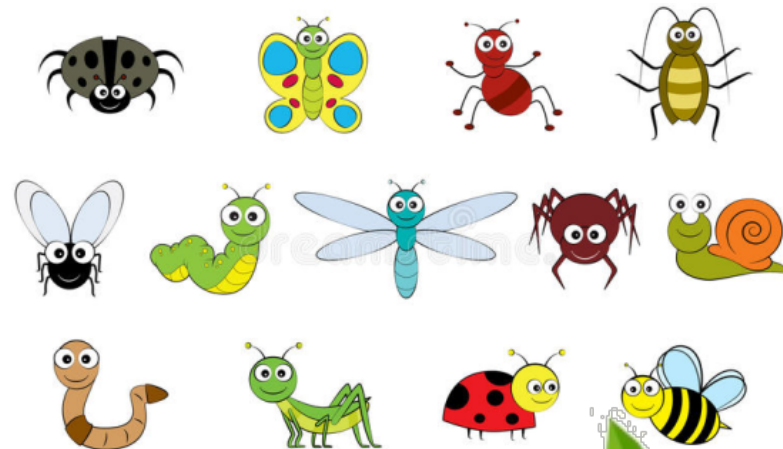
The Challenge:

- Learn to spell common words - there is a list of the 200 most common words on the Website and you can use Spellblast on J2Blast to do this. - Regular reading - remember to discuss what you have read, describe characters, explain events, sequence events, re-tell the story in your own words, use a dictionary/online dictionary to search for the meaning of unfamiliar vocabulary.	- Practice times tables (Don't forget you can also use TTBlast within J2Blast to practise tables) Year 3 - 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10 Year 4 - 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 and 10 - Adding and subtracting Year 3 to use 2 digit numbers eg $67 + 45 =$ / $86 - 34 =$ Year 4 to use 3 digit numbers eg $467 + 382 =$ - Recognise and count money, pay for items in different ways. - Tell the time to nearest 5 minute, then every minute	<u>Keep active</u>- what about joining Joe Wicks' live fitness sessions 9:00 – 9:30am on Youtube (with parental supervision) <u>Help</u> - what about helping around the house? Make your bed, lay the table ready for food, help in the garden? <u>Talk</u>- Have a chat with your parents about your day.

★ Create a mini dictionary about plants and nature. Are you able to write a list of words using each letter of the alphabet?	★ Go on a plant and flower walking hunt. Count the different plants. Record your findings and create a bar graph in HWB.	★ Can you make a bird feeder using recycled materials? Where is the best place in your garden to put it and why?
★★ Write a set of instructions on how to plant a seed. Remember to use 'bossy' verbs like PUT, DIG, PLACE, POUR.	★★ Can you measure the height of different plants in your garden to the nearest cm? What about to the nearest $\frac{1}{2}$ cm? Can you use mm?	★★ Use only natural materials to create a piece of art in the style of Andy Goldsworthy. You could use petals, sticks, grass etc.
★★★ Pretend you are a bug. Write a diary entry describing your day. Remember to write in the past tense and talk about the important things that happened during the day.	★★★ Create a waterstation for your plants. Remember there are 1000ml in a litre. Can you measure the volume of water for your plants?	★★★ Watch the weather forecast on the television. Can you pretend to be a weather man/woman and record yourself broadcasting the weather forecast for that day?
