Theme

How about creating a mind map about Wales? Think of Welsh traditions, places in Wales, colours, foods, sports, rivers and mountains and castles etc.

On your daily walk around your local area, take a picture or record how many welsh signs you see during the fortnight. Create a tally chart/graph (on paper/on HWB) to show your results.

How about building a castle using materials of your choice e.g. LEGO, duplo, blocks, recycled boxes, natural materials (sticks etc). How about pretending to be a soldier in this castle?

Think of your favourite Welsh book. Write a simple book review. Draw a picture of the cover to go with your review.

Ask members of your family who is/was their favourites rugby player? Create a graph on HWB to show your results.

Draw a picture of your favourite place/view in the local area. Use coloured pencils, felt pens or paint to colour it.

Write a fact file/questionnaire about your favourite Welsh rugby player.
Fact File: Use facts about this player and note them in your books/on HWB.
Questionnaire: Ask your rugby player questions e.g. How old are you? How tall are you? etc.

Work with an adult to weigh and measure ingredients to create Welsh cakes/Cawl/Bara Birth. Record the ingredients used.

Perform your favourite Welsh song. How about asking your family to join in? Share your clip with your teacher on Hwb or Twitter.
